Fund raising for NCMOM

On February 11, 2011, the NC Academy of General Dentistry and Triangle Area Dental Services will host the second annual *Roll The Dice for NCMOM* event. Last year's event had an attendance of 300 people and generated over \$10,000 for the clinics. With even greater marketing efforts and more people working on the event this year, we are expecting as many as 500 attendees and even greater revenues.

NCMOM held 12 events in 2010 and is expected to hold another 12 events in 2011. Most NCMOM clinics are held monthly to provide care for an average of 600-700 people. Although the NCMOM project is not a health care system, it is a strong humanitarian effort that brings professionals and communities together to serve those that would otherwise go without care and ultimately end up in the emergency room. In this down economy, NCMOM has maintained its stamina and draws some 200 volunteers from local communities where clinics are held to bring communities together and support the dental care being provided. It is also one of the only ways that the dental profession receives positive public relations. Many legislators have attended our events and have been very impressed with our efforts.

The NCMOM project is the leader in the nation, as many other states only hold 1-2 clinics per year. Due to donations and fund raising efforts, NCMOM is proud to be able to obtain x-rays on each patient with the new x-ray van, as well as provide caregivers with more equipment and better sterilization measures.

If you were fortunate enough to attend last year, you will recall all the fun and excitement of the play money casino. The members of Triangle Area Dental Services have assured us all the great casino games like Craps, Roulette, Blackjack, Texas Holdem', Money Wheel, Triple Shot, and Baccarat will be there again this year so that you can enjoy the games while raising money to support the ongoing efforts of NCMOM. They will also feature virtual horse racing on the giant 16 feet by 9 feet High Def screen. It's loud and exciting and just like being at the tracks. We were told Elvis and Sinatra will make appearances throughout the evening and a DJ will play your favorite music during the rest of the evening.

The members of Triangle Area Dental Services (T.A.D.S.) have been hard at work rounding up some really great raffle prizes and silent auction items. Last year's event had some very interesting and out of the ordinary items and this year should be no different. They will be putting the final touches on the Hors D'oeuvres menu soon and promise to provide table-side wait service so you won't have to leave your playing spot to get food or your favorite drink. Although the RWCDs fully supports the humanitarian efforts of the North Carolina Mission of Mercy (NCMOM) clinics, we neither support nor sponsor this play-gambling event. The RWCDs recommends that all its members support the humanitarian efforts of the NC MOMS clinics both financially and by volunteering.

Together Wake Smiles – Dentists for a Healthier Wake County

Wake Smiles is the volunteer arm of the RWCDs. It is the only volunteer dental service program in Wake County since the Open Door Clinic closed its dental clinic in 2002. Wake Smiles provides emergency, preventive and comprehensive restorative services for Wake County low income adults who would otherwise not have access to dental care. The Wake Smiles board, a group of six volunteers, coordinates the efforts of Wake County dental volunteers, who offer their services at evening clinics and in their private offices.

Adult patients at or below 100% of the federal poverty level are eligible for Wake Smiles. A \$20.00 co-pay per each substantial treatment visit is asked of patients to ensure ownership of their problems and incentive to make their appointments. In certain situations, donors or organizations may cover the co-pay for the homeless or those individuals who cannot make the \$20 co-pay. Wake Smiles works with the following local agencies to treat eligible patients: Wake Health Services, Inc; Wake County Human Services; Urban Ministries/Open Door Clinic; Horizon; Healing Place; Wilmington Street Shelter; Raleigh Rescue Mission; and Salvation Army. Last year Wake Smiles provided 779 patient visits, with 455 of those being new patients, at a value of over \$241,000.

Wake Smiles is presently negotiating with the Salvation Army which has plans for a dental clinic at their new facility on Capital Boulevard. This is a tremendous opportunity for Wake Smiles in its effort to expand services to the underserved and uninsured. To be successful, Wake Smiles and the Salvation Army ***need your support***. You will be hearing more in the near future about funding opportunities to help make this new clinic a reality.

Currently, the Wake Smiles clinic is held in the Wake Health Services Inc. dental clinic at, 2620 New Bern Ave (near Wake Med and the Wake County Health Department). The Wake Smiles clinic is open on most Tuesday evenings except for the Tuesdays the RWCDs meets. On those weeks, the clinic is open on Wednesday evenings. Bi-lingual dental assistants are present most evenings. Wake Smiles needs dentist and dental hygienist volunteers, and encourages dentists to bring their own dental assistant. Dentists may also volunteer by treating patients in their offices.
