-In 2022 we have some amazing things going on:

- ---With funding from AAE and the lead of Dr. David Wong, endodontist, we are starting an Endodontic Initiative at Wake Smiles. PEARLS FROM DR. GARY OYSTER:

Amplify Dentistry's Voice: Join the NC Dental Society

We are all feeling like we are experiencing the movie "Groundhog Day" as the new year has begun. Legislative issues also seem to keep being somewhat the same with new twists.

The NC General Assembly will convene for its short session-the second half of the Biennium-in May 2022. The short session does not offer the opportunity to introduce new legislation. However, changes can be introduced to the existing legislation that originated in and crossed over from the Long Session. This offers the NCDS both challenges and opportunities. I will share some of both

As always we advocate to increase funding for Medicaid adult dental services. The fly in the ointment is the Health Information Exchange which comes into effect Jan. 2023. If you are not signed up you will not be paid for all state funded programs. The NCDS leadership and members must advocate for exclusion of dentistry from this program. We are the only state that has this requirement for dentistry.

We will advocate for APPROPRIATE enhanced training and protocols to ensure patient safety during sedation procedures. As most of you know an unfortunate death during a dental sedation procedure has brought pressure on the BODE and dentists doing sedation to have rules made that will be costly, adversely affect access to care, and as long as proper protocols are followed not necessary.



We will also advocate for reasonable restrictions pertaining to licensure by credentials for faculty instructors. Some of these instructors may not have the qualifications to be credentialed and practice outside a faculty setting.

We must defend dentistry management arrangements legislation against attacks by opposition; monitor and counter attempts by opposition to introduce legislation that may weaken dentist's control over the practice of dentistry

The NCDS is well aware of the workforce shortage and has established a task force to look at all ways to educate Hygienists and Assistants. This cannot happen overnight but we are looking at all ways to get candidates into the pipeline.

Protecting the authority of the BODE, preserve funding of the Oral Health Section, and countering legislation that weakens patient care and safety through scope-of-practice expansion are issues to be monitored

As I have said many times all dentists need to know who their legislators are and have communication with them. Through updates and legislative alerts the NCDS will give you talking points but most importantly you can let your legislator know how positively or negatively a piece of legislation will affect patient care in your practice.

MONEYTALK: Inflation, Crypto and Dentists

January 25, 2022 | This is not financial advice. I'm not a financial advisor. And this is unlikely advice your financial advisor would give you. Now that's out the way...I am a part time practicing dentist and a full time crypto investor, and I'd like to share some thoughts that I hope may enrich you.

Inflation is at a 39 year high, sitting at a hefty 7%. That simply means that any of your cash positions (such as checking, savings, or money market accounts) are losing a lot of value and quickly. If you're invested in the stock market (including a lot of 401K and other retirement accounts) and are conservatively targeting average yearly returns (-10%), you'd be barely beating inflation IF we were in an average year. Which we aren't, and with this latest market correction, the stock market is down -8% for the year.

So, your cash is down 7% from inflation and your stock market holdings are down 15% (market downturn plus inflation). What about other common investment options? What about bonds? Nope. Not even close – -2% bond yields vs 7% inflation.

You might argue that real estate or stock picking or specific sectors of the stock market will outperform current inflation, and you MIGHT be right. But you'd probably need a combination of luck and skill to succeed AND you'd be taking a decent amount of risk to pursue gains that simply beat inflation. And whether you're aware of it or not, this is where we're all at right now: deciding if we want to take outsized risks just to protect our money from simply being worth less tomorrow.

Enter crypto.

You'd accurately point out that if you were holding bitcoin, you'd be down 23% on the year. I'm not suggesting that holding bitcoin is the answer to beating inflation in the short term (though I think there's a great argument in the long term).

What I am suggesting is looking at the crypto stablecoin market. Stablecoins are, for our discussion, cryptocurrencies that peg their value to the U.S. dollar. Simply put: one coin equals one dollar. Unlike pretty much every other cryptocurrency, stablecoins' value remains, well, stable with very little volatility.



Once a person holds stablecoins, they can deposit them into a crypto bank account that accrues interest anywhere from 8-20% APY. That plump,

often times double digit yield, compounds weekly or monthly (sometimes hourly). More importantly to me though, that money remains liquid in a way that requires little effort to transfer back to a traditional bank account. Other benefits often include financial privacy as well as tax efficiencies specific to crypto.

Yes, there's more risk with this stablecoin strategy than holding money in a traditional bank account. There's less regulation and insurance protection (no FDIC). However, the interest rates on your liquid dollar with stablecoins are nearly <u>one hundred times more</u> than a traditional bank account. As such, and to the point of this article, stablecoins in a crypto bank account represent one of a very few great investment options that currently beat inflation <u>without</u> taking on outsized risks.

And so, as you consider ways to protect or grow your wealth, consider stablecoin strategies. For over a year now, I've kept nearly all my cash in stablecoins and found them to be a reliable and relatively safe way to earn at least 8-10%.
